
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How It Started by Class 4


Extracurricular activities



What was the first thing you saw on your first day at Open Gate School?

Well actually it was funny because the first thing I saw was a "closed gate". I mean the upper one, you know. 









Party Class by Nela Hendrychova & Ema Krupickova (Class 3)






